### 5. Citizens recognition:

Citizen, A.J. Hatmaker, Constitution Road, pointed out several locations he has to pass or see every day near his home, in need of clean-up or other attention from the town. The Old Mill apartments, the house below on Harrell St., Taymont, the old Taylor Clinic on Constitution as well as the old town hall property. *Neighbors all mow, clean trash, have presentable view, but what are those owners doing, including the town?* 

Connie Daughterty-Combs reiterated those locations and the fact that the owner of the clinic had been sent letters from the town manager since 2017 and asked how long the town allowed for results. She has also found the tax to still be in her name and has made an agreement with the owner. Should the town need to clean up and assess to taxes, she is ok with that. Keith explained he has been in contact with the owner on several occasions and was in agreement with the process that was to be taking place. Each time a deadline came, the owner indicated he was working on it. Old Mill has been turned over to the county who has said it is in compliance by being boarded. We have lost all inmate labor during the virus shutdown, having recently hired help for 2 on trash truck, mowers and to fill in for an illness. Keith will turn to the county again for help on Taymont and the new owner of the home on Harrell has begun clean-up there. We have re-started brush pick-up as of last week.

Jill Carson added that Pennington Partners was to take on Spring Clean-up this year but we didn't have it, also due to the virus. Keith also noted that once clean-up expense exceeds \$1,000 assessed on the taxes, the town can sell the property. Connie asked if we could then sell Old Mill, Greg Edwards stated that we could not without first cleaning and assessing the cost to them. Old town hall property was being looked at and on the board for clean-up but a succession of water leaks required all the men to be pulled from the job. Jill also relayed that Appalachian Service Project was to come into town and work on properties with Pennington Partners. We don't have help and would love the community to help as we try to enhance the look of the town.

Connie also stated that in daily walks through the park and greenway there are inconsistancies with the council on some things. In the park, no tables, no ball goals, no signage as to why. Some events continue, tennis and Frisbee golf are there. There are no rules posted. Are violators misinformed or uninformed? Also, someone came out early one morning on the greenway, presumably from sleeping there and was a very scarey experience in the dark. Chief Jesse Jones was present and will step up some patrols on the greenway at earlier hours as several are using it to walk then.

Jill reminded everyone of the rise in COVID-19 cases in Lee and the possibility of going back to Phase II guidelines. The management of the guidelines, sanitizing every 2 hours in those public places as the CDC recommends, isn't possible and we don't want to see the park closed.

Connie stated we need signs on the greenway, markings and please reconsider opening pavilions and ball goals. Form committees to help. Terry Pope commented that we do need better communications on the issues. Gary McElyea would like the rules to be mandatory and posted, whatever they are. A.J. finished with the thought, if we work to clean up these areas, others in town will do so as well.

Larry Carter, who is outside of town adjacent the park, has lost several goats and sheep to dogs over the years and now a particular pack from the Red Hill area are crossing over every day and chasing calves. Jeff Martin recognized the dogs' description and knows the owner, will contact the county dog warden on this.

Golden Green, Church Ave. requests the neighbor behind her who dumps trash from her car to an un-mowed yard, along with furniture be asked to clean up. Also, tree limbs have been left behind her

Mathew Johnson, owner of the clinic waited to speak last on his efforts to clean up properties in town, while being told the town would not pick up the trash unless the account at the home was active. He was offered a dumpster pick up as the town has to pay to dump it to the landfill. He apologized to those present with complaints of the clinic as he had been taking the trash there to sort instead of paying for a dumpster. He's trying to make these homes better, although the town is shorthanded, they should help him in doing so. Keith reminded him the dumpster was offered at cost to the town. Also, there are skunks on the greenway that may need attention. He then complained that officers for the town do not have the necessary gloves and finger print kits to gather evidence when he's been broken into. Jesse responded, that although he had only been chief a few weeks, he does have gloves and kits available now and that a recent need for officers to switch and share cars may have made some supplies short.

Keith noted that garbage collection is an issue, a new truck has been ordered and will have a swing arm attached to grab cans and he would like to eventually provide each household a can for such use.
