- A. **Employee Recognition**-Linda Crusenberry was honored by phone with a plaque for her 25 years of Service to the town. Keith Harless was also recognized for 5 years of service and given a plaque by Larry Holbrook.
- B. **Business Window Decorating Contest winners**-Karen Maggard announced that Powell Valley News wins First Place, Farmers & Miners Bank is Second and Roberson Dental Office is Third. They will be given \$50, \$25 and \$15 prizes respectively.

8. Monthly Reports-

Brian Skidmore would like permission to extend the seasonal workers term on a month to month basis since we are still unable to bring inmate help to the job. Terry reminded him he was granted the authority to do so earlier. He also reported the fire department has three used vehicles he would like to sell and use the funds to replace with one, any additional funding would be from County funds.

Jesse Jones reported the finish of Shop with a Cop with the department helping six children. He would also like to purchase and install some cameras in problem areas. He ask council to allow for the overtime rate for special assignment, paid by grant funding, to raise and match the rate the grant allows automatically. The new rate began in October at \$30/hour and is determined by fuel and maintenance costs. Gary McElyea made the Motion to allow for automatic match as the grant changes, Jeff Martin seconded the Motion. Roll call vote as follows:

Treasurer-Tina reported PSA updated balances \$269,000 are due by September 2021. CARES funding deadlines-must incur the expense by December 30 and pay by January 15th. We have received the Municipal Utility Relief grant which will pay on qualifying amounts over 60 days in arrears first. We will be changing our credit card processor to a cloud invoice portal for customers which will provide up to 24 months history of their bill at a cost of \$100/month with a 36 month contract covered by CARES funding. The customer will not pay service fees to use this. Mattern & Craig has been working on the Rural Development grant information and we will be eligible for \$30k grant funding. The pre-audit has gone to the auditors. Jill reminded everyone the recent stimulus package does not include towns/cities. We need to look at the budget

impact due to loosing free labor from the inmate program. Tina estimated that to be \$25k a quarter in expense now.

Keith Harless reported on the Restaurant Support Program and commended employees who made it possible. The public comments are of approval, the restaurants were grateful. The postal service took them mailing in at 6:45 AM and the first public comment by 10 AM. Police are continuing to deliver apartment complexes. Trash bins are ordered for each household with a logo and serial number. A business grant is still available to those in town who have not received other funding. A follow-up of the committee on engineering services recommends three engineers would allow for use on particular projects as needed. Terry Pope made a motion to contract with Goins, Cain, Rash & West, Mattern & Craig and Hill Studios so that rates can be obtained and wording on competitive services be included.  property and we can only ask the owners to comply.
- Terry Pope would like to work with animal control on aligning county laws with the town's leash law. Greg said if there is a violation of town ordinance, town can write the violation and subpoena animal control. He would still like visibility at the Bank Street/Morgan Ave. improved with trimming. He also observed our crew working in extreme cold and wet conditions at the leak near his home and would like to thank all those for their work.
- Jimmy Warner wished everyone a Merry Christmas, the town lights look great and he appreciates all the efforts during the year of COVID-19 circumstances.

Nothing in this subdivision, however, shall be construed to authorize a closed meeting by a local governing body or an elected school board to discuss compensation matters that affect the membership of such body or board collectively.

§ 2.2-3711(A)(3): Acquisition & disposition of property. Provides an exemption for:

Discussion or consideration of the acquisition of real property for a public purpose, or of the disposition of publicly held real property, where discussion in an open meeting would adversely affect the bargaining position or negotiating strategy of the public body. § 2.2-3711(A)(6): Investment of public funds. Provides an exemption for:

Discussion or consideration of the investment of public funds where competition or bargaining is involved, where, if made public initially, the financial interest of the governmental unit would be adversely affected.
