B. Assistant Town Manager's Report-Brian has been working on the EMS for the Town and has a lease agreement for the building, insured it and ambulances. It was noted that he may need to sell some equipment to pay off a debt owed by the former rescue squad. He is confident he can get donations of supplies from surrounding agencies for the first ambulance.

- **C.** Town Manager's Report-Keith attended the first anniversary of the new hospital. He reported that their business plan was to serve 5,000 patients the first year, surpassed with 10,000 in the hospital and 13,000 through the out-patient center. The administrator is very supportive of EMS noting the wait time for transfers is 6-8 hours. We can truly help them with our EMS.
- D. Parks & Recreation-Tammy Jo announced Paint Me Pennington 5K run for kids on the calendar. A circus will be in August at Leeman Field and a Halloween Carnival on October 29 will include Trunk or Treat. Someone questioned mini golf. Keith responded that with the business plan it was necessary for 20/games a day to clear labor costs. Now with minimum wage higher it has doubled those costs. If we could sub out the business, might be possible.

Terry Pope-Noted any questions of our town ordinances follow the VA Code 15.2-901 which says Town has authority to pass ordinances and we have done so, making them valid.

 - § 2.2-3711(A)(3): Acquisition & disposition of property. Provides an exemption for:

 Discussion or consideration of the acquisition of real property for a public purpose, or of the disposition of publicly held real property, where discussion in an open meeting would adversely affect the bargaining position or negotiating strategy of the public body.

Virginia Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(5) Discussion concerning a prospective business or industry or the expansion of an existing business or industry where no previous announcement has been made of the business' or industry's interest in locating or expanding its facilities in the community.

Virginia Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(7). Consultation with legal counsel and briefings by staff members or consultants pertaining to actual or probable litigation, where such consultation or briefing in open meeting would adversely affect the negotiating or litigating posture of the public body. For the purposes of this subdivision, "probable litigation" means litigation that has been specifically threatened or on which the public body or its legal counsel has a reasonable basis to believe will be commenced by or against a known party. Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed to permit the closure of a meeting merely because an attorney representing the public body is in attendance or is consulted on a matter.
