RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Personal Property Tax Relief Act of 1998, Va. Code 58.1-3523 et seq. ("PPTRA"), has been substantially modified by the enactment of Chapter 1 of the Acts of Assembly, 2004 Special Session I (Senate Bill 5005), and the provisions of Item 503 of Chapter 951 of the 2005 Acts of Assembly (the 2005 revisions to the 2005-06 Appropriations Act, hereinafter cited as the "2005 Appropriations Act"); and

WHEREAS, these legislative enactments require the Town to take affirmative steps to implement these changes, and to provide for the computation and allocation of relief provided pursuant to the PPTRA as revised; and

WHEREAS, these legislative enactments provide for the appropriation to the Town of a fixed sum to be used exclusively for the provision of tax relief to owners of qualifying personal use vehicles that are subject tot eh personal property tax on such vehicles;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Pennington Gap Town Council that qualifying vehicles obtaining situs within the Town during tax year 2018, shall receive personal property tax relief in the following manner:

- Personal use vehicles valued at \$100 to \$20,000 will be eligible for 93.12% tax relief
- Personal use vehicles valued at \$20,001 or more shall only receive 93.12% tax relief on the first \$20,000 of value; and
- All other vehicles which do not meet the definition of "qualifying" (business use vehicles, farm use vehicles, motor homes, etc.) will not be eligible for any form of tax relief under this program.
