Unfinished Business-Bill Wireman and Larry Elliott representing Pennington Partners in the Rally SWVA initiative to install a monitor for the theatre advertisement in the front left *Coming Soon* display case. - 10. Monthly Reports-Water, Sewer, Treasurer, Public Works, Police Dept., Fire Dept., Lee Theatre (written Reports in Council packets).

Steve Crabtree and Sam Miles of the Wastewater Treatment Plant – Follow-up on a public hearing held by DEQ last month for permitting of land application on the Yeary farm and some of the discussions; Steve explained the farm had been chosen in 2018 because of little interest by other farmers. Opposition at the hearing came from Daniel Boone Wilderness Trail Association members and neighbors to the property. Operators at the plant believe there is compatibility and compromises in using the farm, should they have to, and not encroach on the trail. Some of the compromises would be:

A. Use the farm as a backup should other choices closer to town not be available.

- B. Over time, nutrient levels come up lessening the application rate, it could be 3-5 years before use.
- C. We are willing to give up to 400 ft. set-back and use fields away from the trail, as the property is 170 acres. After omitting sloped areas and the trail area, 61 acres would be available to use with only 20 acres necessary per application twice a year.
- D. We continue to search for another location with eight potential candidates.

Joan Short with DBWTA offered a non-binding document she described as minutes from the public discussion. As neighbors, they want to work together for visitor benefit and to protect the trail. She was satisfied with a site visit to the plant she attended in which operators detailed the processes and she felt confident of working through the issues.

- 11. Water Plant & Distribution System/Sewer Plant & Collection System/Engineering Projects-Jeff Cochran reported:
  - A. West Morgan Ave. Sidewalk Project- Moving faster with 90% submission, maybe four months before we hear, environmental taken care of and Keith signed on it last week.
