C) Town Manager Report-We have hit lots of rock in trying to lay a waterline. It is very hard to do ourselves. We've tried looking to the future by laying line for the Creech building at the same time with a sprinkler system necessary for the upstairs. In the bank stabilization, engineering will not allow fill dirt. Engineering is not included in the stabilization and Mattern & Craig estimate it at \$50k. We have a contractor looking at the installation of lines and the stabilization which could also create more parking. The Creech building may qualify for a brownfield grant to identify hazardous materials. To qualify, we would have to transfer it from the IDA back to the town.

Family Dollar has a contractor on board. They may break ground in the next 2 weeks. Interviews were held for a clerk and meter reader with decisions pending.

The convention center estimate is elevated but private investors could help us around some regulations. The use of CRW Engineers could help speed up cost estimates. Terry Pope made a Motion to use Cain, Rash, West for cost estimates. Jimmy Warner seconded the Motion. Roll call vote as follows:
